

# COVID-19: Government extends Foreign Trade Policy 2015-2020 till 31 March 2021

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### Summary

In view of the COVID-19 crisis, the government has decided to continue relief under various export promotion schemes by extending existing Foreign Trade Policy (FTP) by another one year i.e., up to 31 March 2021. Further, various other changes have also made in the FTP and procedures to ease the compliance burden of the business concerns.

## Key changes notified in FTP<sup>1</sup>

- Exemption from IGST and compensation
   cess: Exemption from payment of
   Integrated Goods and Services Tax (IGST)
   and compensation cess on the imports
   made under Advance/Export Promotion
   Capital Goods Scheme (EPCG)
   authorisations and by Export Oriented Units
   (EOUs) etc. has been extended up to 31
   March 2021.
- Duty Free Import Authorisation (DFIA):
   Validity period for making imports under various duty-free import authorisations expiring between 1 February 2020 and 31
   July 2020 has been allowed automatic

- extension for another six months from the date of expiry.
- Export Promotion Capital Goods Scheme (EPCG): Benefit under the EPCG scheme shall be available till 31 March 2021. In case where the validity is expiring between 1 February 2020 and 31 July 2020, the same shall be automatically extended for another six months from the date of expiry.
- EOUs, Electronics Hardware Technology
   Parks (EHTPs), Software Technology Parks
   (STPs) and Biotechnology Parks (BTPs):
   Benefit under the EOUs/EHTPs/STPs/BTPs
   scheme shall be available till 31 March 2021.

The service categories eligible under SEIS scheme and rates of rewards on such services as rendered from 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 shall be notified separately.

For the services rendered with effect from 1 April 2020, decision on continuation of the scheme will be taken and notified subsequently.

# Key changes notified in the Handbook of Procedures<sup>2</sup>

 Import of scrap by designated seaports: The time limit granted to existing designated seaports for importing un-shredded scrap has been extended from 31 March 2020 to 30 September 2020.

Further the deadline for de-recognition for the purpose of import of un-shredded metallic scrap has also been extended from existing 1 April 2020 to 1 October 2020.

- Application for Duty Credit Scrips:
  - Last dates for applying for Merchandise
     Exports from India Scheme (MEIS) duty
     credit Scrips has been extended from 12
     months to 15 months from the 'Let

- Export' date falling between the period 1 February 2019 to 31 May 2019.
- Last date for filing SEIS applications for
   FY 2018-19 shall be 31 December 2020.
- Last date for filing online claims for
   Rebate of State and Central Levies and
   Taxes (RoSCTL) has been extended from
   30 June 2020 to 31 December 2020.
- Validity of Status certificates: Validity
   period of the status certificates is extended
   from a period of five years from the date on
   which application for recognition was filed
   or 31 March 2021 whichever is later.
- Advance authorisations: For all advance
   authorisations where the validity for
   imports is expiring between 1 February 2020
   and 31 July 2020, the validity stands
   automatically extended by six months from
   the date of expiry.
- Export obligation period: For all advance authorisations/EPCG/EOUs/EHTPs/STPs/
  BTPs scheme where the export obligation period is expiring between 1 February 2020 and 31 July 2020, the export obligation period stands automatically extended by six months from the date of expiry.

- Where the last date of filing applications

  Where the last date of filing applications

  for Replenishment Authorisation falls

  between 1 February 2020 and 31 July 2020,

  the last date stands extended by six

  months.
- Submission of Installation Certificate for capital goods under EPCG Scheme: The period for submission of Installation
   Certificate for capital goods, where the six-month period expires during 1 February
   2020 to 31 July 2020, has been further extended by six months from the original due date.
- Validity period of Letter of Permission
   (LOPs)/Letter of Intent (LOIs): Validity period of Letter of Permission/Letter of Intent as granted to EOUs, units in STPs/EHTPs/BTPs is further extended up to 31 December 2020.
- Applications for refund of TED/Drawback
   extended: Last date of filing applications for refund of Terminal Excise Duty (TED) or Drawback has been extended to
   30 September 2020.
- Transport Marketing Assistance Scheme: The scheme providing Transport Marketing

- Assistance on the specified Agricultural Products is extended by one year.

  Application for refund for the quarter ending 31 March 2019 and 30 June 2019 may be filed upto 30 September 2020.
- Submission of application: The last date of submission of application for the purpose of late cut shall be taken as per applicable extensions mentioned above.

#### **Our comments**

In light of the COVID-19 crisis, the government's move to provide various tax and compliance reliefs for the businesses at large will help the business community to a great extent during this difficult time.

The decision of the government to continue relief under various export promotion schemes by granting extension of FTP by one more year is another significant and welcome move in this direction.
